



1966 Land Rover Series II A

The successor to the Land Rover Series I, an icon that had made Land Rover a globally renowned brand. The Series II picked up where its predecessor had left off and took the approach of evolution rather than revolution. It was first introduced in 1958 and was available in many different configurations; a soft top, hard top, 7-seater, 10-seater, and even a 12-seater.

It was used by the military of many different nations, the UN used it across the globe, and of course farmers and the royal family had a few. The series II played a large role in creating Land Rover's brand image as we know it today. The fact that it was a global phenomenon. By the time Land Rover celebrated its 20th anniversary in 1968, they had just hit the milestone of 600,000 all-time vehicle sales with the Series II. 70% of all Land Rovers till that point were exported and were dominating the markets in Africa, Australia, and the Middle East.
